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Our Learning Focus - Mindset:

QMS Learning Goal for 2018.2019:



We believe that all students can achieve at high levels with effort, perseverance, resiliency and the right set of strategies. We hope to develop these skills in our students by ensuring that our classroom assessment practices:

- **Provide specific and timely feedback to students (from teachers and peers)**
- **Provide students with opportunities to learn, develop and assess their strategies**
- **Give students multiple opportunities to show what they know**

Growth Mindset and Feedback:

“Feedback is *information provided about any aspect of someone’s behaviour, performance or understanding*. It can be provided by anyone (eg a teacher) or anything (eg the score you get in an online quiz). You can also generate your own feedback—eg when reflecting on a success and the possible reasons for it.

Challenging, effortful tasks need **rapid, high quality feedback** in order to:

- ⇒ Keep learners engaged
- ⇒ Help learners spot weaknesses in their performances (there’s no point practicing and embedding flawed skills or understandings)
- ⇒ Help learners know when they’re getting something right

When **challenge, effort** and **feedback** operate in harmony, learners begin to see their skills and understanding develop in real time—literally growing their abilities and exposing as an absurdity the notion that these are fixed.”

Focused feedback

Feedback is most effective when it focuses on something specific. This gives learners the opportunity to make a useful change and provides them with the information needed to do this. Really good growth mindset feedback focuses on things such as:

◊ The relative levels of effort put into different aspects of the work.

Example: ‘You have put a high level of effort into the start of your work but this has then dropped. Next time, try to keep your effort levels high from start to finish.’

◊ Suggestions about what to do next and why it might improve the work.

Example: ‘Have you considered including more examples in your work? These will improve your writing by making your points clearer.’

◊ Questions which cause learners to reflect on what they have done and how they have done it.

Example: ‘What made you choose to approach the work in this way?’


◊ Identification of the thought processes employed and what these led to.

Example: ‘I can see from your working out that you have been practicing applying the formulae we learnt. This is good; keep it up.’

◊ Challenges to do things differently or to do things which are more difficult.

Example: ‘How could you have made the task more challenging for yourself?’

Winter Season Reminders:

Dress for the Weather:



Note to Parents and Guardians:

During recess and lunch, the students of QMS play outside on the school grounds and adjacent park. Please speak with your child(ren) about dressing appropriately for the weather. Students will go outside most days, including times when it is raining and snowing. Umbrellas, boots, coats, and even an extra pair of pants are important to have available at school for those "not-so-nice" days. It is important for students to get outside and enjoy the fresh air... rain, snow or shine.

Traffic Safety:



With icy winter road conditions, please take extra care when dropping off and picking up your child(ren). Drive slowly through the parking lot and be alert for students crossing to and from the adjacent park.

Students are encouraged to dress for the weather and walk to and from school whenever possible. However, for those of you who do drive, please respect the speed limit, traffic signs and use appropriate parking spaces. Please be on the look out for pedestrians near the school and Community Centre. We want to ensure our students and users of the Community Centre arrive safely at their destinations.

Refrain from stopping in the roadway to wait for your child(ren) as this creates a safety hazard for students and community members on foot and blocks the flow of traffic. The New Westminster Police will continue to monitor the areas around our school to encourage safe traffic habits.



QMS is a **NO-IDLE** Zone.

Closure of Schools Due to Inclement Weather:

In preparation for the possibility of severe weather conditions or other hazards, we are advising parents & guardians that announcements regarding school closures will be made over CKNW and CBC radio stations early enough in the day (usually before 6:30 a.m.), to give parents time to arrange for their children to remain at home. Phone calls and emails will also be made to those parents & guardians who are part of our School Messenger Automated Calling System.

Parents are encouraged to make advance alternate plans in the event of an unexpected school closure.

New Westminster Schools will remain **open**, if at all possible, during inclement weather including snowfalls. However, should a parent/guardian choose to keep their child home on days when the school is open, we ask that you call the school at:

before 9 a.m. if possible. A message can be left at anytime to report an absence.



Cold and Flu Season:

During cold and flu season it is especially important that students learn about precautions that can help safeguard everyone's health. We ask for support from parents in teaching these concepts:

1. Stay home when you are sick or have influenza symptoms.
2. Avoid close contact with people who are sick. If you are sick, keep your distance from others to protect them from getting sick.
3. Cover your mouth and nose with a tissue when coughing or sneezing, and throw the tissue away immediately.
4. Wash your hands & avoid touching your eyes, nose or mouth.

Our grade 7 students completed the Foundation Skills Assessment this October and November. Marked booklets and results will be sent home with students during the week of January 7.

MDI:

During the months of January & February, grade 7 students will be participating in the Middle Years Development Instrument (MDI) by completing an online survey. An email and letter regarding the MDI was sent home to all families of grade 7 students during the week of December 3.

The survey is part of a study led by researchers at the Human Early Learning Partnership at the University of British Columbia. The purpose of the study is to better understand and measure areas of middle child development that contribute to children's well-being, health and school success by asking children themselves about their thoughts, feelings, and experiences in school and in the community. Researchers, schools, and governments use the study results to plan programs and services for children.
