

Our Learning Focus - “Growth Mindset” Feedback:

QMS Learning Goal:

We believe that all students can achieve at high levels with effort, perseverance, resilience and the right set of strategies. We hope to develop these skills in our students by ensuring that our classroom assessment practices:

- provide specific and timely feedback to students (from teachers and peers)
- provide students with opportunities to learn, develop and assesses their strategies
- give students multiple opportunities to show what they know




Grades Are Not Growth Mindset Friendly:

“Grades. (Ugh.) Let’s face it, grades are not very growth mindset friendly. Think about some recent conversations that you have had with your children. Did any of them center around grades on an assignment, test or report card? Probably. Both kids and adults overemphasize the importance of grades. Here’s what you need to remember: Grades suggest where your child is at one moment of time in one particular subject in one particular skill or concept. Grades do not predict your child’s future, potential, or possibilities. A “bad” grade is an opportunity to reflect, regroup, and relearn. Redoing assignments and retaking tests are all part of a growth mindset! Grades focus too much on the final product, not the journey to get there. One of the biggest issues with grades is that some students work really, really hard for a B, C or D...and others don’t work that hard for an A. A hard-working, persistent kid who earns a C may feel more motivated that a kid who receives an A without a whole lot of effort. Some students are so busy trying to make the honor roll or get an A that they can lose their love of learning...and we never want that to happen! We want our children to be curious about things and learn their entire life!

(This excerpt from pages 104-105 of “Nothing You Can’t Do” by Mary Cay Ricci, 2018 was adapted to address parents and guardians. In the book, this excerpt speaks to students directly.)



Student Reflections:

What feedback means to me:

“Feedback can be tips to improve, a checklist or guide, scores, grades and what to try to be even more successful next time.”

“Feedback is something to grow your learning.”

“Feedback is constructive and is someone’s opinion about how you can improve your work. It should be positive, but not sugar coated.”

“Feedback is a strong way to improve yourself because you have multiple points of view from people. Constructive criticism is helpful and isn’t hard to put into action and people get better results with the help of feedback. People can also ask for feedback which is good too. It can help you be more confident talking to others and learning what others think.”

“Feedback lets me know what others think instead of my own biased opinion.”

I like feedback best when:

“teachers check in personally with kids when they give feedback.”

“it tells me what I did well so I can be proud and tells me how to improve so that I still have a goal to accomplish.”

“it includes getting good strategies.”

“it is kind. Kind, positive feedback motivates me to try.”


